The TEAK Fellowship believes that motivation and potential, not economic circumstances, should determine a student's future. TEAK unlocks access to an outstanding education and transformative experiences for exceptional NYC students, who use these opportunities to change their lives and the world around them.

ABOUT TEAK

Established in 1998, The TEAK Fellowship is a free 10-year middle school, high school, and college prep, access, and success program in New York City. TEAK empowers exceptional students from low-income families to achieve their potential regardless of their economic circumstances. TEAK's robust support system ensures that students thrive in top independent and selective high schools, and graduate from college, ready to pursue their professional goals and positively impact the world.

Since 1998, every single Fellow has matriculated to four-year colleges; of these, 89% have entered top-tier schools, averaging 30% into the Ivy League each year. Of the students who have completed the Fellowship, 90% are college graduates and leaders in multiple professions. Building on these accomplishments, TEAK has begun working to serve even more youth who need our help to gain acceptance into top schools and colleges.

DISCOVERING FUTURE LEADERS: ADMISSION INTO TEAK

TEAK's six-month admission process starts in 6th grade. We seek out exceptionally talented students from all across New York City who have the potential to become leaders in their schools and communities. After a highly selective process, TEAK admits a cohort of 45 students each spring.

THE JOURNEY BEGINS: MIDDLE SCHOOL ACADEMY

In addition to attending their public middle schools throughout the academic year, TEAK students complete advanced course work two days per week at one of our three sites located in Brooklyn, Queens, and the Bronx. They also attend TEAK's Summer Institute (an intense 6-week academic enrichment program) for three consecutive summers, intended to fill any educational gaps in preparation for the rigor of competitive high school TEAK enriches a student's life in the classroom and the offerings like a Shakespeare class, an overnight soarding school, exposure to the arts, and field trips to an and cultural institutions. Additionally, TEAK pairs each student with a volunteer adult mentor to offer support and guidance throughout their journey.

HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT & HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Beginning in 8th grade, TEAK helps guide students through the high proof admissions process. Once students matriculate, TEA shaures their success by providing services such as tutoring, one-on-one advisement and social-emotional support, and SAT prep. During the summers, TEAK students have access to transformational experiences such as serving a community at a non-profit, traveling abroad, finding their voice in a college-level creative writing course, and career immersion internships.

RECENT SUCCESSES

This past spring, **TEAK** placed 100% of high school seniors at four-year colleges and universities, where they collectively earned over \$7.2 million in need-based scholarships and financial aid over four years, covering 92% of college costs. These students earned admission to esteemed schools, including: Boston University, Columbia University, Cornell University, Harvard University, Haverford College, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Northwestern University, Tufts University, and University of Pennsylvania.

TEAK placed 100% of graduating middle school students at selective high schools where they were awarded \$8 million in need-based financial aid over four years, representing 91% of their total school expenses. Schools include: Deerfield Academy, Peddie School, Friends Seminary, Horace Mann School, The Lawrenceville School, Regis High School, and Stuyvesant High School.
